What is Battle of the Books?



- A quiz-bowl style competition that takes place at the end of the school year
- Students compete by answering questions about the novels on the annual book list provided by FAME.
- The questions are **student-generated**, **text-dependent** questions written by Volusia County students each year.

Battle Rules and Guidelines

The Team

- Each school will be permitted to send one team of no more than 5 members to compete.
- A team captain must be assigned. The team captain will be responsible for providing the team's answer. The team captain will be the only person to provide a response.

Battle Format

- There are two rounds of battles Preliminary Battles and the Final Battle.
- The two schools with the highest scores from the Preliminary Battles will advance to the Final Battle.
- The winning team of the Final Battle will be the Battle of the Books champions.
- In the event of a tie, the battle will enter Sudden Death. Similar to rules for a spelling bee, the winning team will need to answer the round question correctly, as well as the champion question.
- Each battle will start with 5 low-level questions and then conclude with 5 high-level questions.

Low-Level Questions

- Levels of questioning will be indicated on the published list distributed in February.
- Low-level questions will be worth 1 point each.

• For low-level questions, students will have 20 seconds to discuss the answer before the team captain must provide a response.

High-Level Questions

- High-level questions will be worth a total of 2 points (1 point for the correct answer and 1 point for the appropriate textual evidence).
- For high-level questions, students will have 30 seconds to discuss the answer before the team captain must provide a response.

Study Guides/Notes

- Students will NOT be permitted to use their notes for low-level questions.
- Students will be permitted to use their notes for high-level questions.
- Students may NOT use their notes during a Sudden Death.
